HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FORESTS OF MAINE TEACHERS TOURS

- Changes in Forestry and changes in education – Discover and discuss them in the Maine woods.
- Tours combine math, science, technology, language arts and Social Studies with current information about forest practices, up-to-date technology and research into new products.
- Preference will be given to two-teacher teams from the same school in case of over-subscription.
- Project Learning Tree's nationally acclaimed preK thru HS environmental education curriculum is the framework for learning more about the importance of Maine's forests.
- A PLT facilitator, industry or consulting forester, landowner and state forester will accompany each tour. Participate in lively discussions in the field, on the bus and over meals.
- Participants will complete a Project Learning Tree workshop that includes training in curriculum materials with links to the STEM and the NGSS. Many additional materials about Maine forests will be made available.
- Each participant will be certified as a Project Learning Tree Teacher and be eligible for certification of contact hours. Participants are given the opportunity to register and pay a \$12 fee for their own CEU's after the tour. All information available to teachers on each tour.
- We will visit a variety of renewable energy facilities on both tours, encompassing wood in familiar and more recent technologies.
- Maine Tree will cover all but \$125 of tour-related expenses, including overnight accommodations, air-conditioned motor coach travel and your selection of meals and beverages. Your \$125 registration fee will help us defray some of these expenses. The actual cost of room and board for each participant is over \$800.

WHEN YOU PARTICIPATE IN OUR TOURS, YOU CAN LOOK FORWARD TO:

- A stimulating time with interesting people at a beautiful location in the Maine woods. You'll start at 1 p.m. on Tuesday with a Project Learning Tree workshop, and finish by 11:00 a.m. on Friday with time for discussion, teacher presentations and evaluations.
- Good meals and facilities at fine Maine lodges, with time to socialize and to discuss information and issues relating to Maine's forests.
- Travel to woodland and mill destinations via air-conditioned motor coaches, equipped with toilet facilities and television monitors for viewing videos on forestry and forest issues.

TOUR #1, JULY 9 – 12 LIBBY CAMPS – NORTHERN MAINE

Our first Tour will be based at Libby Camps (<https://www.libbycamps.com>) on Millinocket Lake, -T8R9- in the heart of Maine's big woods. These camps are managed by Matt & Jess Libby, fourth generation owners since 1977. Libby Camps is located about forty-five minutes from Ashland. Our tour will focus on long-term, sustainable management of Maine's forests. We will visit nearby logging operations, sawmills, and will have opportunities to discuss field operations and multiple use management considerations with foresters, wildlife biologists and other natural resource professionals.

Academic credits (undergraduate or graduate) are available through Dr. William Livingston, Associate Director of Undergraduate Programs, School of Forest Resources, University of Maine, Orono. TOUR #2, JULY 23 – 26 GRANT'S KENNEBAGO CAMPS – RANGELEY LAKES REGION

Our second tour will be headquartered at Grant's Kennebago Camps (<http://grantscamps.com>), in Stetsontown Township. Grant's Camps have been in operation since the late 1800's. They are situated in the heart of western Maine's Rangeley Lakes region and afford ready access to large tracts of timberland that have been managed sustainably by private, tribal and state ownerships since the middle of the 19th century. As with all our Teachers' Tours, this tour will focus on long-term, sustainable management of Maine's forests. We will visit nearby logging operations, sawmills, and will have opportunities to discuss field operations and multiple use management considerations with foresters, wildlife biologists and other natural resource professionals.
